
A celebration for Mothers' Day

Hannah had not forgotten the promise she had made though, and soon after she had weened Samuel, she gave him to the LORD.




Samuel grew in wisdom and became one of Israel's greatest prophets, warning his people to return to the LORD, to serve only God.




And just like Hannah, who rejoiced and gave thanks to God when Samuel was born,

we also celebrate today those who rejoiced when you were born,


because they love you very much.
